CERTIFICATE OF APPRECIATION

The National Time Release Study (NTRS) 2024 was conducted from 01-01-2024 to 07-02-2024 and report of the same was released by the Chairman, CBIC on 19.07.2024. As per findings of NTRS 2024 the Average Release Time (ART) for clearance of import cargo at JNCH has come down, as compared to the Average Release Time as measured during the NTRS 2023. This is an encouraging finding, especially because due to Transporters' strike during the period of NTRS 2024 there were logistics bottlenecks which had delayed the clearances during that period, as compared to the normal times.

- 2. Right from the stage of preparation for NTRS 2024 as well as during the period of NTRS 2024, the BCBA has worked closely with JNCH Customs. It has also been observed that the members of BCBA have often contributed to the knowledge pool of the entire Customs clearance fraternity by guiding other stakeholders too. All this contributes to faster cargo clearance.
- 3. Recently BCBA had also partnered with JNCH Customs in organising an Open House on Faceless Assessment in which nearly 400 members of the trade has participated and very fruitful discussions were held, towards the goal of improving Faceless Assessment in Customs.
- 4. I place on record my sincere appreciation for your entire team which leads BCBA and I am hopeful that the members of BCBA will continue to diligently contribute towards smooth clearance of import / export cargo and to keep the flag of JNCH flying high.





Any other business with the permission of the Chair.

Hon.Secretary requested the Members to share their observations, views, points if any. He also requested Members to provide their names and their organization name for recording purposes.

Mr.Nimish Desai, M/s. N.H. Desai & Co. congratulated the entire BCBA team. He stated that the data which BCBA shares about the mails being sent out were even greater than the entire government of Maharashtra doing it. He added that BCBA was excellent in sharing information on Whatsapp as well as Twitter and to also upload on Youtube the recording like the wonderful one conducted 10 days. Mr. Nirav Thakker responded that BCBA has a You tube Channel and all such seminars / webinars and informative sessions are regularly uploaded on You tube for benefit of the members. He said the QR code for accessing the Youtube Channel is available on each table in the Annual report.

Mr. Manohar K Shanbhog, M/s. Freight Carriers Pvt. Ltd. informed that there are Bill of Entries which have been passed in the RMS and we have to get in out of charge. Can we not get in the system itself which Appraiser is giving out of charge rather than moving and meeting 2-3 people and find out who is doing it? President replied that it was a good point. & that there was good amount of progress towards that. When your Bill of Entries get facilitated under RMS more than 50% of the time, our staff can sit in office and check whether it's out of charge is done or not. Because under Turant custom when it was implemented in the year March 2019 the Bill of Entries could no longer be chosen for giving out of charge; they come serially like they come on the assessment side in the shed, docks serially one by one. President added that such issues of SSOID generation are typically faced on a working day after long holidays and BCBA JNCH and CFS team were always there to ensure that if by 5:00 pm they found that there was delay in generation of SSOID's, immediately a communication written and verbal was made to senior Additional Commissioner and Commissioner of the clusters and RMS Cell to ensure that all out of charge are generated on the same night itself. President stated that on the point of Air Cargo, he suggested that he should visit Air Cargo with our team and advised that what staff reports may not be true always. He added that if there are any bottle necks being created artificially for not providing out of charge then we would support you in all possible manners. President added that when there is a problem with the department the entire team of BCBA is ready to support him. Mr. Shanbhog mentioned that we should get the CFS charges online and not by email. President replied that this is one point which BCBA has very specifically addressed with CFSAI for the best practices to be adopted by some of the CFSs. A meeting will be held with BCBA and CFSAI to finalize the best practices.

Mr. Sorab P. Engineer, M/s. S. D. Engineer & Son LLP congratulated the entire committee who has been extremely supportive towards our community and has been on standby as described on a 24/7 basis. He mentioned that while coming here he received a notice to the effect that there is a new system by some CFSs of not allowing deduction of TDS in the CFS bills which is illegal. TDS has to be deducted on all payments to be made. He requested to prevent it from spreading across to other Organizations because it will be very detrimental to our CBs. President mentioned that the point is well noted and added that this was regarding JWR CFS. This had been conveyed to us we had spoken to their owners, Mr Jobanputra who has specifically conveyed they would look into this issue because deduction of TDS is a law unless they go across and get those exemption certificates like shipping lines. He added that everybody any Indian company has to follow the law of land and there were some issues. They did come up with a counter that some of the Custom Brokers were deducting TDS and not depositing the same. This also was a legal violation if somebody was doing it. But while making the payment to CFS deduction has to be made as per section 194.

Mr R.Radhakrishnan, M/s. Clearship Forwarders Pvt. Ltd mentioned that he was only here to congratulate the team. There were two major achievements which were already mentioned. One is the relief on the suspension of CHA license and another is the co-noticee. The great achievement what really people want is that type of a relief that you get which is going to be a long time process by which we will all be grateful. Number three is kudos to BCBA for becoming the partner with J.N.Port to develop skill that is also need of the hour. Skilling our people is the greatest need, because with more and more skilled people, the



industry is going to grow. President said that it was dedicated to the teams hard work.

Mr. Nishigandh K. Redkar, M/s. Clear Cargo Logistik congratulated the team for the wondeful achievements. Continuing with the point of skilling, he said that our Custom Brokers have been skilling for the last 80 years. But now there is a need to skill the custom officer who was joining the department, since what we find in the export assessment, the officer has interpreted the rules as per his convenience, and not as per the law. He suggested the team that we should have a skilling session for the custom officer, because normally they consider us as the main pillar in the trade, but they do not respect us on that. And we have to every time convince them, argue with them for that. He suggested to the team that we should keep a session in a month for the new officials who are joining the custom department for skilling them. This he had suggested to NACIN also that let our team come on the board to train the officer so that the interpretive rules are taken as per the trade and not as per their interpretation. President replied that this was one point which BCBA and FFFAI have been addressing at all forums. Because if we want growth, if we want to become third largest economy globally, change of mindset is required. And the change of mindset is not only required at the top level, but at the grass root level also, be it Customs or our staff or ourselves. Also, we need to reinvent ourselves and this is the key.

Mr.Vijay N.Nagrecha, M/s.Mohanlal & Bros. congratulated everyone on being a very good performing team. Pertaining to this point, he suggested that we can rather ask customs, what is their interpretation and it should be by way of a Public Notice so that the point can be conveyed to our clients and CBs should not face a problem. If there is a public notice they have to obey it or otherwise, like BIS also. they are not properly following the compulsory compliances list. They are showing the highest list and blackmailing. So rather, we approach them and ask them to give a public notice regarding what exactly they want and circulate that to the trade. President mentioned that he would like to brief the house that transparency and predictability is one aspect that we are addressing. Our entire focus here is that particularly for BIS we have circulated an email id that whenever any officer raises a query that whether this particular article requires BIS

certification or not. If there is any doubt there is any confusion, there is an email id provided by BIS authorities. It was circulated after the CCFC meeting at Mumbai Custom Zone I and members have got lot of positive feedback regarding whenever they have posted a query on that at least 50 60% of the time BIS authorities have replied to that. President requested Members to put forward their issues where they were facing some perennial problems and we will have them addressed, the Committee is here to support you in any manner.

Mr. Shantanu S Bhadkamkar M/s.SME Logistics Pvt Ltd. congratulated the whole team. He mentioned that he was a witness to lot of proceedings and work happening. So all make us proud when the whole team works. You can see how much power we get. He stated that he had two suggestions and he was saying that publicly though he could say in the Managing Committee so that members are aware of both suggestions. He suggested that one Managing Committee meeting should be broadcasted to the members. He applauded BCBA on the commencing of Centre of Excellence and we have to ensure that proper programmes are held at Centre of Excellence.

Mr. Vinay Krishnan, M/s.Proficient Cargo Services India LLP stated that the team had supported the members day/night. When the Committee members were contacted at night they had patience to listen to our complaints, hats off to the entire team. He said that the reason he had stood up was that there were lot of problems with the shipping companies, he gave an example of M/s.

Hapag Lloyd who charged penalty of Rs.1 lakh for 11 tons container. He mentioned that we should not allow the shipping company to get away with this kind of extraordinary fines. President mentioned that his point was well noted and his feedback was always very valuable. He mentioned that this matter was addressed with CSLA by our shipping line team and we will keep Members updated on the matter.

Mr. Vinay Krishnan mentioned that we were printing and circulating the hard copy of the Annual Report booklet and suggested that we can make it in the form of an e-booklet. President replied that we were circulating it via e-booklet also and printing of booklets is only bare minimum for the attendees. President replied that his point was well noted and the needful will be done.

Mr. Omprakash Agrawal, M/s.Nagarkot Forwarders Pvt. Ltd. greeted the President and the entire team heartiest congratulations to all, all have done an excellent job during the last one year by taking care of all the members. He added that when he received a notice from the Customs for the audit observations, he brought it to the attention of President and the team and it was immediately addressed very strongly with the Customs and for the first time Chief Commissioner of Customs, Mumbai Zone II and later Mumbai Zone I issued advisories asking their offices not to initiate any proceedings against CBs where they were not involved for this classification or this disputable matters. He thanked the President for the great job done by BCBA and even in this forum also he

would like to express his gratitude towards the Association and entire team for taking up this issue. He added that the Board has also issued a circular on this subject, so this was really a great achievement for our association.

Mr. Yogesh S. Thacker, M/s.S.J.Thacker Freight Forwarders Pvt. Ltd. explained in detail about the problem faced by him with Customs. President replied that his point was very well noted and addressed sequentially. In the month of January or February when there were tremendous delays being faced by investigation by CIU or SIIB, BCBA has addressed this issue specifically in PTFC meeting and CCFC and also directly with Chief Commissioner of Customs that in any investigation, it was observed that even to draw samples they used to take about 4 to six weeks and send a sample for testing immediately, they ensured that CIU was removed from direct examination and Public Notice was issued. President requested that if there were any further issues please do write to BCBA and provide feedback.

Mr Manish Chatwani, M/s.MAC Transoceanic Pvt Ltd. Expressed the issues regarding CBs being penalised under the provision of section 112 and 114 of Custom Act. He requested to take up suitable action with Authorities so that CBs are not penalised like Importers and Exporters. He also requested for improvement in CBLMS module to ensure that Custom passes are issued on timely basis. He further requested that in case of suspension of their CB licence Commissioner issues the notice for all passes to be surrendered immediately and there should be some transitional arrangement available for clearance of their pending goods. President mentioned that this issue was already addressed with the Principal Commissioner of Customs, Mum Zone 1, Mr Sunil Jain. We have already had two meetings with the Principal Commissioner of Customs. He has asked the Member to meet him in New Custom House on 30th August for highlighting and seek the relief. President replied that the second point regarding passes whenever there is an act of suspension, there is always an order issued that the following Shipping Bill and Bill of Entry shall be allowed for clearance. We have ensured that whenever the issue has been highlighted we have ensured by representing to customs that these Bill of Entries and Shipping Bill shall be allowed for clearance and if any custodian is not allowing





you to carry out those clearance please do write to us. Mr. Nimish Desai clarified that we have to write to the DC, CB Section that we have live consignments pending giving Importers name B/E number and date, shipping bill numbers and dates and Customs will then permit you to retain custom passes. They will also permit you to complete those documents. Mr. Manish Chatwani informed that he had already done that and was going from New Custom House to Nhava Sheva, finally after 4 days he got permission after paying detention demurrage. President replied that there was a process already in place and he explained that some CBs had a problem regarding clearance of their pending consignment in case of suspension, the letters were issued the next working day. The authorities, whether it be CFS's or Air Cargo, they have permitted the clearance on the passes. President mentioned that if anyone had any issues or if any customer is facing this issue, entire team is out there to support you.

Mr.Rajen S Bhatia, M/s.Tulsidas Khimji P.Ltd. congratulated President and the team for the fantastic work that he has been doing and he highlighted his case. He mentioned that last year on 1st December 2022 they got a notice from Customs and their CB licence was suspended. They approached BCBA and he was happy to inform that in 40 days their license was restored with the hard work and the swift action taken by BCBA. He urged all the members that if they had any trouble to approach BCBA. The team was fantastic and led by the President himself who was available to help

24 by 7. He added that in the history of BCBA, in 40 days the license was restored, so its kudos to all of us.

Mr.Suresh Dalvi, M/s.Indian Seaways appreciated the work done by the all Committee members of BCBA under the leadership of Mr. Dushvant Mulani. He thanked BCBA for the major achievements during the year 2020 to 2023. First CBIC Custom instructions regarding the suspension of the Customs Brokers license not to be carried out in the routine or mechanical manners. This was the landmark circular for the entire Custom Brokers community. Second is Custom Brokers not to be implicated in the case of a interpretive dispute in the show cause notice issued, the advisories have been issued by the Mumbai Custom Zone I, and II. Third is CBLMS launched by the Mumbai Customs Zone I project was successfully launched by the Mumbai Customs along with BCBA. Fourth is we are also thankful for life time validity of the Custom Brokers license. These are the major landmark achievements by BCBA. He requested the house to give them a big round of applause for these achievements.

Mr.Mark Fernandes, M/s.Sylvester & Co. applauded the BCBA team for their unity, support and tireless efforts in serving its Members. He complimented BCBA for issuance of CBIC instructions No.24/2023 which conveys that CB licence cannot be suspended following the principle of natural justice without carrying detailed enquiry.

Mr.Sailesh Bhatia, M/s.Bhatia Shipping Pvt.Ltd. mentioned that the Committee was doing a brilliant job. The way our business is evolving the needs are also growing up in leaps and bounds. He conveyed that in Income Tax Act there is a provision that the officers are rated on the basis of assessments they carry out, any assessment they do wrongly which goes into appeal and that assessment is set aside there is an internal scoring where the officer is held accountable for that wrong assessment. Mr. Sailesh Bhatia said that similar to Income Tax. he suggested that based on quality of orders they pass in Appellate forums and sustainability of the same in higher appellate forums, the rating should be given. Further he suggested that we should focus on new processes to work out a mechanism for smooth custom clearances.

Mr.Manohar Shanbhog mentioned that BCBA Committees are for the BCBA by the BCBA and of the BCBA. So we shall wholeheartedly support BCBA team. He said we must make sure that our staff works for us and not for the Custom Officer. He further added that the E office at the airport is unmanned and most of the time there is nobody sitting there. President replied that it was an all India issue and we have addressed that with CBIC. E-office is a gross failure which we have highlighted, instead of reducing time it has added time.

Mr Shankar Shinde, Chairman, FFFAI greeted the President, Office Bearers, Advisors and the entire Managing Committee Members. He mentioned that it was fortunate for him to get trained under this institute. A lot of learning has undergone while working with BCBA and all of the members also to experience the way they have been working as a member of the managing committee, also the

amount of sacrifice which is required not only in business but in family also, hats off to the way they work. BCBA is a role model for all the 30 Associations across India. He mentioned that if anything happens we first refer to BCBA. So the responsibility is not only limited to the 2300 members it is more than 6500 members whom they are responding today. This is the outreach or this is the bandwidth on which they are working. It was really an achievement what we have here also at the national level also more than the 50% of the achievement, is because of the BCBA Managing Committee efforts. President was not only working as a President, but as a Chairman of the Federation of Freight Forwarders Association, which is the Apex body of 30 Custom Brokers Association in India. The reports what they receive from BCBA helps to make a representation at the board level also. And that strengthens them and that is where they find more important significant engagement with FFFAI. It is FFFAI which has started from the BCBA office initially and now grown up to the level from six or seven Associations to thirty Associations. It is really a great achievement. He congratulated BCBA on the WCO certificate and the important thing which he would like to really thank and acknowledge BCBA is for CBLMS. It was not only at the level of BCBA which they have activated the CBLMS but helped all the 30 Associations members giving the assistance and thanks to Mr.Manohar Patyane and his team who is looking after it 24X7 to get all India CBs on board, which was highly acknowledged by

CBIC. The next challenge received was the ECL. The initiative was really a surprise for FFFAI since they wanted them to have the seminar on implementation of ECL within two days. He further stated that we will have to focus upon the skill development. It is the area which we have to work upon jointly.

BCBA team had represented regarding difficulty faced due to re-assessment of Bill of Entry on account of change of BL / AWB details. Directorate of Systems, New Delhi issued necessary software upgradation and auto regularisation of BL and AWB details is now happening for Bill of Entries filed in advance.

15) Simplified online procedure for filling and processing Bill of Entry Amendment request at JN Customs and Mumbai Customs — PN No 13/2024 and 09/2024 dt 25.7.2024

To curtail the parallel manual file work, a simplified online amendment request can now be made from CB's office with help of above Public Notices.

16) Issuance Of PN: 46/2024 Dtd 24th May 2024 At Mum Cus Zone I Regarding Mid Year Special Drive (MSD) For 3 Weeks

Based on the representation by BCBA, A Mid-Year Special drive (MSD) for 3 weeks with Mumbai Customs Zone II was held to identify the bottlenecks in Custom Clearance Process and take corrective action.

17) Simplified process for issuance of H, G and F category Custom Passes

HONORARY SECRETARY'S ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2023–2024





Dear Member / Colleagues,

I am pleased to present the Annual Report of the Brihanmumbai Custom Brokers Association for the year 2023-2024.

I am delighted to inform all that BCBA through its dedicated secretariat has circulated a record 1663 circulars and submitted 514 representations. BCBA Office Bearers and Managing Committee have attended 154 meetings with various organizations in the last one year. BCBA has believed in setting a high standard of responsive communication with its members to keep them abreast of the latest updates regularly.

This year, our membership number has increased from 2335 and the current membership count is 2391 members. BCBA extends a warm welcome to all our new members and expresses gratitude to the existing members for their continued support.

I wish to highlight to all our members and trade at large about BCBA's continued hard work throughout the year, which has resulted in achieving many awards and accolades.

BCBA Conclave: BCBA held its 1st ever Logistics Conclave 2024 'Amritkal of Logistics - Vision 2047' on 27.06.2024 at Hotel Taj Mahal Palace, Mumbai providing a detailed insight regarding the upcoming development in the region and highlighting what the future holds for Custom Brokers. The 1-day event was inaugurated by the senior most Government authorities & leaders of the industry and attended by 400+ participants. There were more than 30 talented and extremely proficient speakers lined up for the business sessions, sharing their knowledge and experience with the audience. The Association received a lot of accolades for the event.

Seminars / Webinars: BCBA has organized more than 20 webinars and seminars for its members during the year on important topics like Classification, Valuation, CAROTAR, Cybercrime Awareness, RoDTEP etc. to keep them updated on the latest changes in the industry and knowledge sharing on the important aspects which are for the benefit of all the Custom Brokers

Interactive Sessions / Workshops:
Being a crucial link with the department and members, various Open House discussion meetings were organized with Mumbai Custom Zones for interaction of members with department and resolving queries on important topics like Faceless Assessment, Custom Broker Licensing Management System (CBLMS) and AEO. Many outreach programs were also conducted with the trade bodies as well as Participating Government Agencies like FSSAI, WCCB, ADC, AQ etc. to extend and enrich the proficiency of the members.

(B) Advocacy & Representations

Regulatory Engagement: BCBA Committee has been actively engaging with the CBIC, DG Systems, Customs House & Field Formations as well as other regulatory bodies like PGAs and Trade bodies to advocate for policies that benefit our members. Notable achievements include:

- Relief from Hon'ble High Court of Bombay by granting unconditional stay on recovery of Penalty from Custom Brokers
- Certificate of Appreciation from the Chief Commissioner of Customs, Mumbai Zone II, Nhava Sheva for assisting in swift cargo clearance and reducing the dwell time
- Obtaining interim order and stay from Hon'ble High Court for implications on Custom Brokers being made Co-noticee and unconditional coercive action being taken against Custom Brokers.
- Discussions with Mr. Rajiv Jalota, IAS, Chairman of Indian Ports Association (IPA) and Mumbai Port Authority (MBPA) at BCBA office on implementation of measures for Port Automation.
- Organizing a helpdesk at Air Cargo Customs for solving difficulties faced in verifying the applicability of SCOMET rules on Exports
- Getting Duty Drawback approvals and processing with 3 days on daily basis all 7 days of the week from Mumbai Custom Zone III
- Holding a Mid-Year Special drive (MSD) for 3 weeks with Mumbai Customs Zone II to identify the bottlenecks and Custom Clearance Process

Member Representation: BCBA Committee has represented its members at many meetings with key stakeholders, ensuring their voices were heard in discussions affecting the customs brokers industry and favorable resolutions were sought. Here are a few ones highlighted:

- Clarification from Ministry of Steel regarding applicability of BIS License only where ITC-HS is mapped with the IS Code in the QCO Portal of BIS
- Non-requirement of submission of Original Free Trade Agreement (FTA) Certificate from South Korea
- Various products of PGA like FSSAI, ADC etc which were being wrongly marked to PGA for requirement of NOC as well as for Examination under imports. Air Cargo Customs issued Public Notice in regards to the Overriding the instructions of RMS and assuring smooth clearance.
- Representation for Simplifying, Streamlining and Expediting the Amendment procedures in Import Consignments which resulted in issuance of Public Notices by Mumbai Customs and JN Customs for enhancing trade facilitation
- Simplifying the procedure for revalidation of Self-sealing permission of factory Stuffed Export Containers which were nearing the date of expiry.

(C) Training & Skill Development

- **Signing of MoU:** BCBA has been privileged to have the opportunity for an esteemed association with Jawahar Nehru Port Authority (JNPA) for engaging in skill enhancement, training, mentoring for the youth in the field of Customs, Ports, Shipping & Logistics. This partnership will have the highest impact of creating a pool of talent for the industry and meet the demands of the skilled manpower required at the upcoming Vadhwan Port, the largest port in India.
- Skill development Partnership with Customs Department: BCBA Managing team has been given the golden opportunity to be engaged with National Academy of Customs, Indirect taxes and Narcotics (NACIN) for conducting various training workshops for the Custom Department officers with Embarkation, Preventive Department and

- other New joined trainees. This progressive step by the Department will help in capacity building and bridging the gap between department and trade to be cognizant of the issues and reduce the difficulties involved in the smooth functioning of the clearance process. Other engagements include training by Airport Customs officers at BCBA Office in Hybrid mode on the new Obligation Management System (OMS) initiative for the benefit of trade.
- G-Category Exam: To provide best quality service to the trade and meet the regulatory compliances, Custom Brokers need skilled employees and with the representation by BCBA to Mumbai Customs for organizing an additional exam in the same year for Custom Broker junior members and employees to appear and get permanent customs pass (G-Category), this Exam was conducted very professionally by the Mumbai Customs for the benefit of Custom Brokers and the application procedures were also simplified based on the representation by BCBA.
- Training for Regulation 6 Exam: The BCBA Training Committee has always been ahead for the uniqueness in designing the Regulation 6 program for the Custom Broker aspirants and to nurture them in becoming successful Entrepreneurs. BCBA Training Committee has conducted various programs which include Orientation for the Course, Multiple training sessions with professionals and certified trainers for Online Examination as well as Mock Viva sessions for succeeding in Oral Exams.
- Engagement at International Forums:
 BCBA team has taken us various initiatives
 for partnering with trade organizations of
 other countries like World Bank, World Trade
 Center, Miami USA (WTCM), Port of Barcelona
 in Spain, Trade Mission from Sri Lanka and
 Consul General of Turkey for increasing trade
 lanes and creating business opportunities and
 knowledge exchange.

(D) Financial Review

 Revenue & Expenditure: BCBA strong Financial health is based on the maintaining a balanced budget and efficient management of resources



• **Investments:** BCBA has purchased some new cutting edge technology for keeping up with the requirements of the digital era and productively made some long term infrastructure investments.

(E) Challenges & Solutions

- Operational Challenges: During the year we faced slight challenges related to some regulatory changes with new rules and regulations being implemented, changed levels of compliances and introduction of new ones, Customs Portal & Duty payment system issues due to technological upgradation and other issues related to freight rates, availability of containers, extended transit times, limited sailing schedules etc. due to geo-political scenario.
- Member Concerns: Various modes of feedback mechanism have been implemented by the BCBA team for obtaining the issues highlighted by members and the same have been addressed at various levels for achieving suggestive measures as emphasized in this report. An important initiative of signing an MoU with State Bank of India shall prove to be extremely beneficial for members in the coming months wherein they would utilise the various services and verticals of SBI, customized to the needs of the members.

I would like to express my profound gratitude to our President Mr. Dushyant Mulani, Office Bearers, Board of Advisors and entire Managing Committee. My special thanks to the entire BCBA Secretariat for their sincere approach and continuous efforts in serving members and the fraternity.

I would like to place on record that the entire Managing Committee and Secretariat staff have

strived relentlessly round the clock to support the Custom Brokers for handling timely clearances of export and import consignments of their clients. They have helped to mitigate not only day to day issues, but also worked on providing guidance and training the members to adapt to the changing environment and prosper in their activities.

My deepest gratitude to Customs Department including all the Governmental and Non-governmental organizations like CBIC, DGS, MBPA, JNPA, MIAL, as well as trade bodies ACCAI, AMTOI, CII, CAI, CSLA FIEO, FFFAI, IMC, INSA, MACCIA, MANSA, for their continued support and cooperation extended to BCBA in serving the Custom Broker Fraternity.

This committee is chaired by **Mr. Paras Shah** & **Mr Kamal Shah** and the office bearer in charge is **Mr.Vinayak Aparaj**, under whose guidance this committee have addressed many issues, some of which are placed below.

This Committee has regular interactions with JN Customs and members. Queries and grievances of members were attended on daily basis by this Committee. Few important achievements which were addressed are as follows:

- The earlier practice was for extension of validity of self-sealing permission was for 3 years but after due representation by BCBA, the same was extended for 5 years. Public Notice No 94/2023 dated 20.10.2023 was issued where the self-sealing permission for factory stuffed containers for exporters already registered with EDI, Nhava Sheva Customs and valid upto 31.12.2023 was extended for 05 years upto 31.12.2028.
- On regular representation in various PTFC meeting, JN Customs also started issuing similar Monthly Public Notice containing there in list of EGM Errors. at JN Customs.
- Procedure for Back to Town of Export Cargo at JN Customs vide Earlier PN No 01/2023 was deliberated
 at length with JN Customs Authorities in various forum and subsequently PN NO: 75 / 2023 dated
 31.8.2023 with relaxation to certain category of exporters.
- Based on request of the Association, Export Promotion Monitoring & Analysis System (X-Mas) was introduced by JN Customs vide PN No 02/2024 dated 11.1.2024.
- On request of JN Customs, The Association hosted a meeting for officers inducted into the Export Commissioner at our Centre of Excellence on 11/6/2024
- JN Customs had requested for inputs for digitization / automation required in Exports. BCBA has also given a presentation where few important points address regarding Shipping Bill Amendments Post LEO to be done in EDI System, Provisional Assessment in EDI System, Option to download Shipping Bill Copy & Gate Pass from ICEGATE, Facility of display of shipping bill date for last 7 days should be reinstated etc to JN Customs where inputs given by BCBA were taken up in good spirit.
- BCBA was continuously in interaction with JN Customs Authorities for monitoring handling of Examination as per PN No 19/2023 and 50/2023 at All CFS. We are glad to inform members that after successful representation, JN Customs have started examination process in shifts.
- Request to Discontinue Levy of Penalty for B.T.T. shipments and Bonafide amendments was addressed by BCBA. Upon successful representation in PTFC meeting held on 1.1.2024, JN Customs have informed that where there is no non-compliance or misdeclaration, and the party is taking back the goods purely due to commercial or logistics reason, then there is no question of any penalty. So it was relaxation to members.



Haz class, 5,6,7 & 8 shipments as per PN 46/2017 were going under Open Examination wherein BCBA addressed the issue with JN Customs to get the shipment cleared under scanning. We are glad to inform members that an Internal order has been passed for Haz goods to be cleared under scanning and if any grievance further has to be brought to the knowledge of higher authorities.

BANKING COMMITTEE

Two Important Circulars were sent to members regarding

E-way Bill system Advisory on HSN code

GST Authorities had issued Notification No 78/2020-Central Tax dated 15th October, 2020, where it was necessary to provide at least 6 Digit HSN code for all the B2B and Export Transactions by the taxpayers whose Annual Aggregate turnover (AATO) is more than Rs.5 Crore. The taxpayers, with AATO less than Rs. 5 crore, need to provide at least 4 digit HSN code. This validation would be implemented in e-way bill system from 1st February, 2024.

Hence the taxpayers were advised to make necessary changes in their system and enter 4 / 6 digit HSN codes while generating the e-way bills through web and API systems from 1st February, 2024.

Generation of E-way bill without linkage of E-Invoice for B2B AND B2E Transactions

As per Press Release dtd 5.1.2024 issued by GST Authorities E-Invoice was made mandatory for taxpayers with AATO above Rs. 5 crores. The taxpayers, who are eligible for e-Invoicing, are generating e-waybills without linking with e-Invoice for B2B and B2E transactions, which was leading to mis-match in the e-waybill and e-Invoice statements.

Hence to avoid such situations, e-waybill generation will not be allowed without e-invoice details from 1st March, 2024. This is applicable for e-invoice enabled tax payers and for the transactions related to supplies under B2B and Exports. EWBs for other transactions such as B2C and non-supplies will function as usual without any change.

E-waybill generation process will be incorporated with appropriate checks for taxpayers (Suppliers) eligible for E-Invoicing. Incase of B2B and B2E (Exports), direct e-waybill generation with e-Invoice will not be allowed for suppliers eligible for e-Invoicing. This applies to the E-waybill categories of Supply/Export/SKD/CKD/Lots.

However, e-waybill generation for transactions related to B2C and other non supplies will be allowed as usual. Similarly, for E-waybills generated by transporters, similar check would be enforced on the Supplier GSTIN. Other operations such as Part B updating, transporters ID updating, etc. will continue as usual without any change.

All Taxpayers and transporters were requested to make necessary changes in their system so that they can adapt to the changes from 1st March 2024.

INSURANCE COMMITTEE:

GROUP ACCIDENTAL INSURANCE POLICY FOR MEMBERS AND THEIR EMPLOYEES

The Group Personal Accidental Insurance Policy is an effort to secure life of the employees of BCBA members. There are several benefits of personal accident insurance as under;

- Accidental benefit for Rs. 10 Lacs per employee
- It also gives financial assistance to the employee and their family members in events such as bodily injuries, death caused by accidents, permanent total disability, temporary total disability, or permanent partial disabilities.
- 1. BCBA CFS Smart Card linked with Insurance Cover which includes insurance premium for one year.
- 2. Members also have option to apply for Insurance cover only under Insurance Scheme (Excluding CFS Smart Card) on annual premium basis.

In the past 1 year, almost 4800 + members have applied for CFS pass and more than 25 members have applied for Insurance. All these members are covered under the Accidental Insurance cover upto a value of Rs. 10 Lakhs.

Long Time taken to shift the cargo from Courier Mode to Cargo Mode: Delays in the transfer
of courier shipments from courier mode to cargo mode was again addressed by BCBA in the ACC CCFC
meeting held on 23.1.2024.

Transfer of courier shipments from Courier mode to Cargo mode was a perennial issue causing inordinate delays. Upon successful representation by BCBA, we are glad to inform members that APSC Courier Cell issued a PN no 05/2024 dated 6.2.2204 outlining the procedure for Transshipment through ECCS Application of goods imported at International Courier Terminal Sahar, Mumbai to other Ports or to Air Cargo Complex Sahar, Andheri East, Mumbai. This P/N has ensured that courier shipments are transferred much faster and has drastically reduced the dwell time enabling faster clearance of goods from cargo mode.



TRAINING AND SKILL DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

The Training committee is led by **Mr.Tej Contractor** and **Ms. Chaitaly Mehta** under guidance of the office bearer in charge is **Mr. Sanjeev Harale**, under whose guidance whose guidance this committee have conducted training courses for members.

The Brihanmumbai Customs Brokers Association (BCBA) has been providing training programs to its members on customs clearance programs like Rule 6 and G Card Training. The efforts of the committee are aimed at ensuring that members stay updated and proficient in the ever-evolving customs landscape.

BCBA has held a session for G Category Candidates and CBLR Candidates at BCBA Office Board Room. The association provided comprehensive training on various topics such as import-export procedures, classification, valuation, and documentation.

This partnership aims to develop various skill-building training modules to prepare youth for employment. These trained youth can initially join our industry members as interns, helping to address manpower shortages and also to build a workforce ready for the future.

sssssThe Association has also embarked on several initiatives which have helped Owners / Partners / Proprietors / Directors to enrich themselves with the latest development in various aspects, mainly envisioning for future, compliances etc.. These programs were designed to help members understand the nuances of customs clearance procedures and equip them with the necessary knowledge to operate successfully.

There were more than 3000 participants for all the programs. Skill development, speed and scale are the 3 important aspects that are relevant to the present-day growth and development module.

Authorised Economic Operator Committee

AEO is an important initiative taken by CBIC to enrol all stakeholders who are part of international supply chain to ensure safety, security and revenue protection of EXIM trade The Indian AEO is a programme under the aegis of the World Customs Organization (WCO) SAFE Framework of Standards to secure and facilitate Global Trade. The programme aims to enhance international supply chain security and facilitate movement of legitimate goods. Under this programme, an entity engaged in international trade is approved by Customs as compliant with supply chain security standards and is granted AEO status along with tangible benefits.

BCBA had provided Helpdesk for Custom Brokers to become AEO. The Association has also helped many Custom Brokers to achieve AEO LO status which in turn has helped them considerably to gain accredited status in the logistics field.

The various benefits and objectives can be achieved by becoming AEO to Exporters and Importers as well Customs Brokers in the long run.

BAGGAGE COMMITTEE

This committee is chaired by **Mr. Kamal Shah** and the office bearer in charge is **Mr. Nirav Thakker**, under whose guidance this committee has addressed issues which helped the Custom broker staff members to carry out smooth clearance processes. Some of the activities are placed below.

Discontinue of the Passport stamping practice for TR benefit

Multiple representations were made to the department regarding doing away with the stamp being endorsed on the Original Passport of the Passenger who was availing the Transfer of Residence (TR) benefit. Reference to Circular 12/2000 was given which mentions that this practice must be stopped as it was causing hardships to the passengers for explanations during visa application / cancellations. Besides, the SQL system works perfectly fine now after the initial glitches were surfaced to department by BCBA. Based on the representations by BCBA, the passport stamping process has now been stopped, which will eliminate complications in post clearance requirements.

Clearance of Unaccompanied Baggage of Foreign Nationals under Transfer of Residence (TR).

A lot of ambiguity was surfaced, and members were facing issues regarding clearance of Unaccompanied Baggage (UB) shipments of foreign nationals arriving into India for the first time on Employment Visa but were not being granted TR benefits. Matter was addressed and jointly with Customs, a solution was achieved, wherein an undertaking from the Employer was to be obtained and TR benefits were allowed to the Foreign Nationals.

Many members had been issued Summons / Show Cause Notices regarding past UB shipments cleared but alerts raised by NCTC regarding application of TR twice in a short span, which is not permitted as per Baggage Rules. The incidences were explained to the department with practical situations why the system wrongly selected such cases, whereas there was no second TR claimed. Assistance was provided to members for appropriate responses to the Summons / SCN to resolve the issues.

A few matters are actively being followed up to achieve positive solutions such as Online filing of baggage form through Icegate, Benefits of TR extended to passengers who import Live Pets or urgent Household commodities by Air and also for the sea UB shipment arriving subsequently.

On a regular basis, many issues such as delays in clearance of UB shipments due to system issues, duty payment module, CFS infrastructure etc. are being jointly addressed, and prompt corrective measures are undertaken to resolve the issues of members in a timely manner by BCBA.

Regarding Carnet de Passage (CDP) shipments for tourists importing their motor vehicles into India for tours / rallies, representation has been made by BCBA with suggestive measures for reducing the number of steps & time by simplifying the process of Customs clearance.

BCBA strives to provides timely notifications and alerts to its members, ensuring they are aware of any changes or issues related to the EDI system. These updates help the trade to be prepared and adapt to potential challenges, mitigating disruptions to their daily operations & improve their processes.

BCBA EDI Committee has issued more than 63 circulars & written more than 35 letters. Below is an highlight of few milestone representations made by EDI

> Manual clearance of Non referred Bill of Entries on AQCS portal

27.09.2023 There was an issue of connectivity of the B/Es in the AQCS system. Many B/Es of Nhava Sheva Port as well as Mundra Port were held up at AQCS and no NOCs were granted from last 2-3 days. Due to this, Out of Charge of B/Es could not be granted and many deliveries were held up. Association had represented the matter with the AQCS authorities. We are happy to inform that AQCS office was giving manual clearance for the Bill of Entries which were not referred on ICES portal or to AQCS portal https://indialog-pga.logistics.gov.in purely on adhoc basis. Members were requested to clear Bill of Entries referred to AQCS, Mumbai on the basis of manual NOC/NOC LG/OOS/REJECTION issued by AQCS office for those Bill of Entries which were not reflected on either portal until complete migration of Bill of Entries to new portal was accomplished.

> Launching of the online portal of AQCS

On various representations from BCBA, AQCS have issued Public Notice No.File no.:15(Admin)/AQCS Mum/2023/149 dated 27.9.2023 wherein they have informed that the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Govt. of India has launched online portal for import clearance system of AQCS. BCBA requested all Members to visit the link mentioned in the circular and register themselves urgently.

> Representation regarding delay dual use NOC granted by ADC

A lot of difficulties were being faced by Members with regard to the delay in dual use application at ADC. Circular was sent to Members to share the details with a copy of the acknowledgement to the Association, the same was taken up with ADC authorities.

> Representation regarding Updation of the dual use item with all PGA's

it had been discussed that the dual use items list should be reflected in the PGA system website. With regard to this matter, BCBA had also submitted letters to the PGAs for List of Out of Scope Items and



publishing the dual use item in their website as well as sharing the same with BCBA to inform our members and trade to save dwell time

> Issuance of clearances through AQCS ICS portal only w.e.f. 22.1.2024 by AQCS, Mumbai and discontinuation of manual clearances

Circular No.F.No.(Imp)AQCSMum/76 dated 18th January, 2024 issued by Animal Quarantine & Certification Service, Mumbai with regard to issuance of clearances through AQCS ICS portal only w.e.f. 22.1.2024 by AQCS, Mumbai and discontinuation of manual clearances was circulated to Members.

> BCBA successfully represented regarding paperless working with ADC office at JNCH and ACC Mumbai

BCBA successfully represented the matter in CCFC and PTFC meetings regarding paperless working and application of NOC for import and export consignment online.

JNCH and ACC ADC office have started the online process of issuing NOC and have shared their Email ID. This has helped members substantially by reducing paperwork and dwell time.

Guidelines for speedy Online NOC - Submission of documents/files in online mode for import and export consignments at ADC (I) JNPT, Seaport, Panvel

During the meeting with ADC, BCBA had received intimation from ADC office JNPT to follow the steps circulated by them for getting online NOC on speedy mode. The same was circulated to Members for their guidance.

Representation done by BCBA regarding delay in issuance of NOC by AQCS

There was a huge delay in issuance of NOC from the office of AQCS. Many challenges were faced by Members and trade which were represented by BCBA to AQCS, New Delhi on 30.4.2024.

Representation made regarding Increased Testing and Delays in Test Reports for Imported Goods at Textile Committee and FSSAI

There was a considerable increase in the number of tests conducted by the Textile Committee and the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI), along with delays in the receipt of test reports. Additionally, we had encountered instances where Customs Tariff Headings (CTHs) were being routed to FSSAI unnecessarily, further compounding these delays and have significantly impacted the efficiency and cost-effectiveness of our import operations. The same was represented by BCBA to the Commissioner of Customs, (General), Jawahar Custom House, Nhava Sheva on 14.06.2024.

Delay in testing of samples by PGAs

Representation was made by BCBA to the Commissioner of Customs, (NS III) RMS Cell, Jawahar Custom House on 19.6.2024 as per the feedback received from our Members and Importers regarding delay in testing of samples by PGAs viz. Textile Committee, FSSAI and Animal Quarantine. On an average, it was taking 8-15 days for testing of samples and for receiving Test Reports. We requested that such consignments should be released on provisional basis till the time the Test Reports are received from the concerned PGAs.

> Representation made regarding Delay in sample testing at CDTL West Zone Mumbai

The Trade was facing tremendous difficulty in getting sample report from CDTL Lab, West Zone Mumbai. The samples given for testing at CDTL lab West Zone, mumbai were taking more than 1 month, which resulted in increase in transaction cost and dwell time for clearance. All the samples which were going for testing were usually high value material which were used in production and any sort of delay in testing of samples by CDTL Lab would amount to huge loss to the Importer as the production was also being held up. On 29.7.2024 BCBA requested the Dy.Drug Controller (I) WZ and ADC (I), ACC to follow the earlier practice of sending samples to other govt. approved laboratories where the samples were tested within 7 days, which would ensure faster clearance.

STAMP DUTY COMMITTEE







Mr. Vinayak Aparaj

This Committee is chaired by **Mr. Ashok Kumar Saini** and the office bearer in charge is **Mr. Vinayak Aparaj** under whose guidance this committee has addressed the following issues.

- The payment of Stamp Duty was seamless and smooth except in isolated cases where the GRAS site was working erratically and Members were unable to make stamp duty payments for import shipments arrived at all ports due to which members were unable to take delivery of their consignments. Also those members who had paid the stamp duty, CFSs were unable to deface the challan due to which deliveries were hampered. The matter was escalated to GRAS authorities for their intervention. For transitional arrangement, an undertaking was to be given by the Custom Broker to the CFS at the time of taking the delivery that the payment of Stamp Duty will be made as soon as the operation of GRAS Portal starts functioning.
- ➤ Members were guided for making refund application and in many cases the refund was expedited after the intervention by BCBA. However no update on the refund has been received from Members as the same is presumed to be resolved/refunded.
- The day to day issues of Stamp Duty of our Members were addressed and resolved successfully.



On behalf of the BCBA Shipping Line committee It brings us immense pride to share that our Association has successfully resolved a majority of member concerns within 4-24 hours from the initiation of complaint.

This achievement underscores our commitment to providing prompt and effective solutions, ensuring that our members experience minimal disruption in their operations. We continue to strive for excellence in our services and support, reinforcing the trust and confidence that our members place in us.

We thank all our members for their cooperation and feedback which have been instrumental in enhancing our response mechanisms. We remain dedicated to further improving our processes and maintaining high standards of service delivery.

The committee is tasked with addressing the challenges faced by stakeholders in the shipping line sector, which is currently undergoing significant disruptions.

These disruptions are primarily due to a surge in demand for shipments to the USA, which has altered the balance of trade and logistics. Additionally, complications in Red Sea transit routes have contributed to unprecedented delays.

To effectively tackle these issues, the committee engages with shipping Lines to manage members issues

By taking a proactive approach and fostering collaboration among industry players, the committee helps mitigate the current challenges and support a more resilient shipping infrastructure.

The Shipping Committee has observed a consistent decrease in the challenges experienced by our members over the years while dealing with the main line carriers (CSLA Members), which is a positive indication as highlighted in this report.

As we continue to monitor and address any remaining challenges, we are encouraged by the progress made and remain committed to supporting our members in overcoming any obstacles they may face in their operations.

For reference of members some of the common challenges that members facing with NVOCC / Shipping Lines are :

- 1) Non-Compliance of JNCH Public Notice 01/2017 (Movement of container to nominated CFS)
- 2) Non-Compliance of One Time Default Intimation (OTDI)
- 3) Delay issuance of DO & Extension Letter
- 4) Off loading of Empty & Damage Containers


- 5) Excessive Charges by Shipping Lines
- 6) Refund of Security deposits


The BCBA has been consistently submitting the concerns and challenges faced by its members to the customs department regarding the violation of the aforementioned public notices.

- The Association had requested and had a meeting with DG Shipping to discuss measures to improve logistics performance in EXIM Clearance.
- There were challenges faced with Maersk Lines due to cyber-attack & T S Shipping Lines regarding delay in issuance of invoices & Delivery Orders to our members, where the Association resolved on one-to-one basis.
- The Association has made representations to CSLA regarding issues related to Off-loading of Containers at the empty yard

Furthermore, the most significant challenge we are still encountering is the impending implementation of the Sea Cargo manifest regulations. While this may not have a direct impact on brokers, it is crucial for us to stay informed about the upcoming changes and their potential indirect effects.

Container damage is a significant issue that our members face on a daily basis. In order to alleviate this burden, BCBA is currently in discussions with AMTOI to develop a best practice guide for handling container damage.

At its core the committee has ensured that there is no downtime of equipment by giving annual maintenance contracts to respective agencies. The committee has also setup infrastructure to make sure timely broadcasting of circulars, public notices, and other relevant information through registered e-mails as well as through the use of social media takes place. We are proud to mention that this has become an industry benchmark.

1. Implementation of SSO Login for Service Providers

Following the update of developing SSO login last year. We have intitated discussion with multiple service providers who have shown interest. Discussions are going on with service providers to identify potential benefits for members. We have a total of 108 members who have registered themselves on the portal. We look forward to active registration from everyone.

2. Strategic Partnership with SBI

The State Bank of India (SBI) has signed an MOU with BCBA. This collaboration will provide BCBA members with access to a range of banking, financial, and insurance products tailored specifically for customs brokers. NOTE "1"

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2024.

1. Significant Accounting Policies

I. Basis of Preparation Of Financial Statement

The financial statements have been prepared to comply with generally accepted Accounting Principles in India (Indian GAAP) including the "Accounting Standards" notified under the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013.

The financial statements are prepared on accrual basis except those with significant uncertainties.

II. Recognitions of Income & Expenditure

Income and Expenditure are accounted on accrual basis as they are earned or incurred.

III. Fixed Assets

The Gross Block of Fixed assets are stated in the accounts at the purchase cost of acquisition of such assets including any attributable cost of bringing the assets to its working condition for its intended use.

IV. Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on written down value as prescribed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

V. Taxes on Income

Provision for taxation has not been provided since the Association claims that the entire income is exempt on the grounds of mutuality. Association relies upon the decision of Chelmsford Club v Commissioner of Income Tax (109 Taxmann 215), Bombay Presidency Golf Club Ltd. v ITO, ITAT Mumbai (69 Taxmann 208) and Breach Candy Swimming Bath trust v ITO(E), ITAT Mumbai, ITA no 3825/M/2013. Further the Association is registered under section 12(A) of the Income Tax Act, 1961 & is assessed under section 11 of Act. Deferred tax assets/liabilities have not been recognized considering the principle of prudence.

- VI. Based on Managing Committee decision, the Association has written back contribution towards Legal & Professional fees collected in F.Y.2011-12 and F.Y. 2013-14 of Rs. 57,85,250/- and Rs. 26,098/-respectively.
- VII. An amount of Rs.29,46,170/- is receivable from members which are outstanding for a period more than ten years. The said members are either non-operative members or non- traceable members. The Association has taken necessary steps to recover the said outstanding membership fees.
- VIII. During the year the Association has prematured the fixed deposits with Banks, since the rate of interest on fixed deposits were lower as compared to current rate of interest on fixed deposits. The new fixed deposits are taken at a higher rate of interest and the Association will receive more interest at compared to prematurity charges on fixed deposit.
- IX. The association has given deposits to Airport Authority of India (AAI) in the form of fixed deposits amounting to Rs 12,88,999/- (including interest) for the use of common user room at Air Cargo Complex for the members of Association. The fixed deposit after maturity has been encased by AAI in F Y 2019-20. The Association has taken necessary steps with AAI headquarters in respect of refund of the amount encashed by AAI.

- X. An amount of Rs.13,66,065/- shown as receivable from Federation of Freight Forwarders Association in India being reimbursement of AGM expenses held on 22-09-2017 is under negotiation with Federation of Freight Forwarders Association in India and is shown as receivable.
- XI. Compensation bills from JNPT in respect of use of space by Service Centre at Nhava Sheva (JNPT) has not been received from 01-01-2021 and therefore as per Managing Committee decision, the provision of compensation of Rs.9,73,503/- is written back.
- XII. Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets: Provisions are recognized only when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be outflow of resources. Contingent Liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes to accounts. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed.
- XIII. During the year, Association has written off an amount of Rs. 1,59,156/- pertaining to membership fee and table space.
- XIV. Receivable from members, other receivable, deposits given and other current liabilities are subject to confirmation.


